Dear Friend,



## WHO WE ARE


As a global community of Child Champions, we advocate for children in hard places – speaking up on their behalf. We work to bring hope and provide holistic care – body, mind, and spirit – so they can flourish. Together, we empower children around the world to overcome poverty, thrive, and reach their God-given potential. We pray that as these children achieve their dreams, they will invest in the next generation and transform their churches, communities, and countries.

## HOW WE BRING HOPE

- Through **OneChild’s sponsorship program**, kids around the world receive vital care like nourishing food, medical checkups, educational opportunities, and mentoring. Kids also learn about God’s everlasting love. Plus, each child is matched with a caring sponsor who helps them believe that a better future is possible.
- For more than 20 years, OneChild has partnered with **New Life Home Trust** in Kenya to rescue, care for, and find adoptive homes for abandoned and vulnerable babies, including those affected by HIV/AIDS. Many of these babies come in need of medical intervention and are lovingly nursed back to health.
- **Happy Horizons Ranch**, a partner with OneChild, is a place of healing and hope for sex traffic survivors in the Philippines. Child Champions in the Philippines partner with local law enforcement and the International Justice Mission to rescue girls and bring them to this safe haven, where they discover a new beginning.

## A NEW BEGINNING

*We hope you are encouraged by this story that you are helping make possible ...*

Miguelina, a single mom of seven kids, is incredibly grateful for OneChild’s sponsors and donors who are helping her children reach their God-given potential. Each day, Miguelina works diligently as a school janitor to support her family. But like many parents in the poverty-stricken community of Los Rieles, Dominican Republic, she barely makes enough to survive.

However, the moment three of her children were sponsored, their lives were transformed. Through the program, the kids are receiving life-changing care like nourishing food, medical checkups, educational opportunities, and mentoring. They are also learning that God loves them more than they can imagine.



“The Hope Center is a safe and secure place for my kids,” says Miguelina. “When they are there, I have peace knowing they are being instructed in the ways of the Lord, are well taken care of, and are being fed. My biggest dream is to see my children become men and women of God and be professionals one day.” Because of their caring sponsors, Miguelina is confident they will get there.

After seeing the positive changes in her children’s behavior, Miguelina decided to join the church connected to their Hope Center. Today, Miguelina is growing in her faith and enjoys reading the Bible with her kids. She’s even started volunteering at church.

And because Miguelina had experienced a devastating tragedy, she also sees the church as her support system. In 2010, she lost her beloved 3-year-old son, Waldy, after he drowned. With tears in her eyes and pain in her heart, Miguelina says finding her lifeless son in the river was the hardest moment of her life. Even today, she still sets a dinner plate at the table for him. But thanks to the emotional support she receives from the pastors, church members, and Child Champions, she has found the strength to move forward.

Through the generosity of sponsors and donors, their family was also grateful to receive the greatest gift they could imagine — a new home. In Los Rieles, many families live dangerously close to the river, and flooding threatens their lives and homes every rainy season. After the church received a donation from a visitor, Child Champions in the Dominican Republic were able to build Miguelina a new house, away from the floodwaters where her son drowned. This solid home has allowed the family to heal and feel safe as they continue to build their future together.

Miguelina has a special message for OneChild sponsors and donors. “In my heart there is only gratitude!” she says. “It’s amazing to know that in another country there are people who love and are a blessing to my kids — even without knowing them personally. I pray to God every day for you, that He continues to bless your lives in a way that you can continue to bless other kids in need.”
