

GLOBAL FOOD CRISIS

During the past year, families around the world faced a global food crisis — one of the most severe ever seen in our lifetime — and children were the hardest hit. As inflation skyrocketed, many parents couldn't afford to feed their families. This year culminated the development of a new platform to support international ministry. In 2022, OneChild launched Bridgely, an innovative way of connecting communities across cultures to serve mutually transformational relationships and effective generosity. OneChild will use the Bridgely platform to radically expand our ability to reach children in hard places. We believe that Bridgely will allow us to reach 100,000 children by 2025. Even beyond that vision, we are developing Bridgely to be a Kingdom-wide platform to serve many other ministries as well.

HOW WE BRING HOPE

Through **OneChild’s sponsorship program**, kids around the world receive vital care like nourishing food, medical checkups, educational opportunities, and mentoring. Kids also learn about God’s everlasting love. Plus, each child is connected with a caring sponsor who helps them believe that a better future is possible.

For more than 20 years, OneChild has also partnered with **New Life Home** in Kenya to rescue, nurture, and find adoptive homes for abandoned and vulnerable babies, including those affected by HIV/AIDS. Many of these babies need urgent medical intervention and are lovingly nursed back to health.

Happy Horizons Ranch, another partner of OneChild, is a safe haven for sexually exploited children in the Philippines. Child Champions in the Philippines link arms with local law enforcement and the International Justice Mission to rescue girls and bring them to the ranch, where they discover God’s healing and restoration.

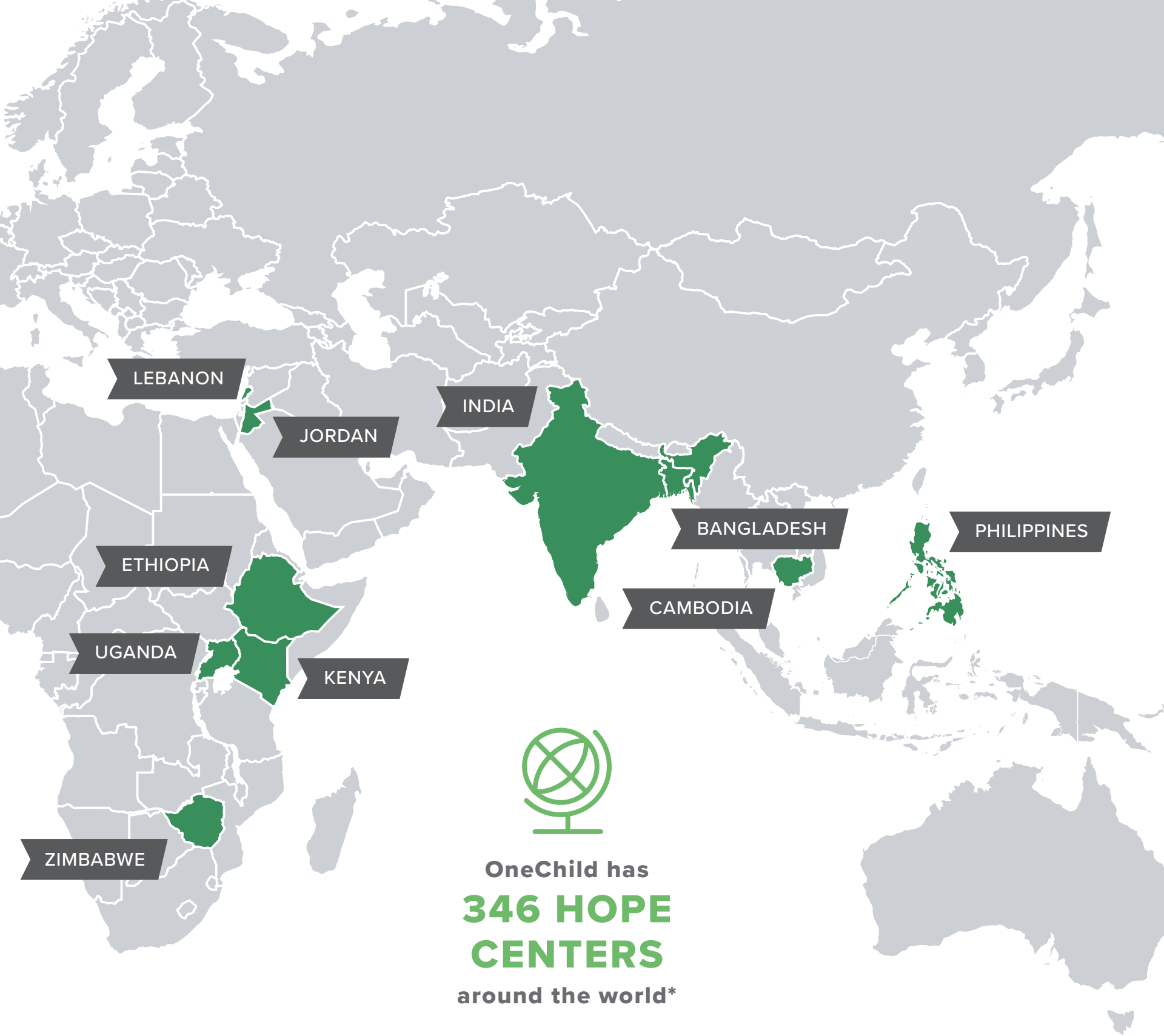

A GENEROUS GIFT transforms a family's future

STORY BY EMMANUEL MWANGALA, A CHILD CHAMPION IN KENYA



When families in Kenya receive goats, it provides a steady source of milk and income, which often changes their lives.

We hope that you are inspired by this story that caring partners like you helped make possible ...

Ndurya will never forget the moment that he received a phone call informing him that his son, Mwandoro, had received a special gift from his sponsors. He was overjoyed.

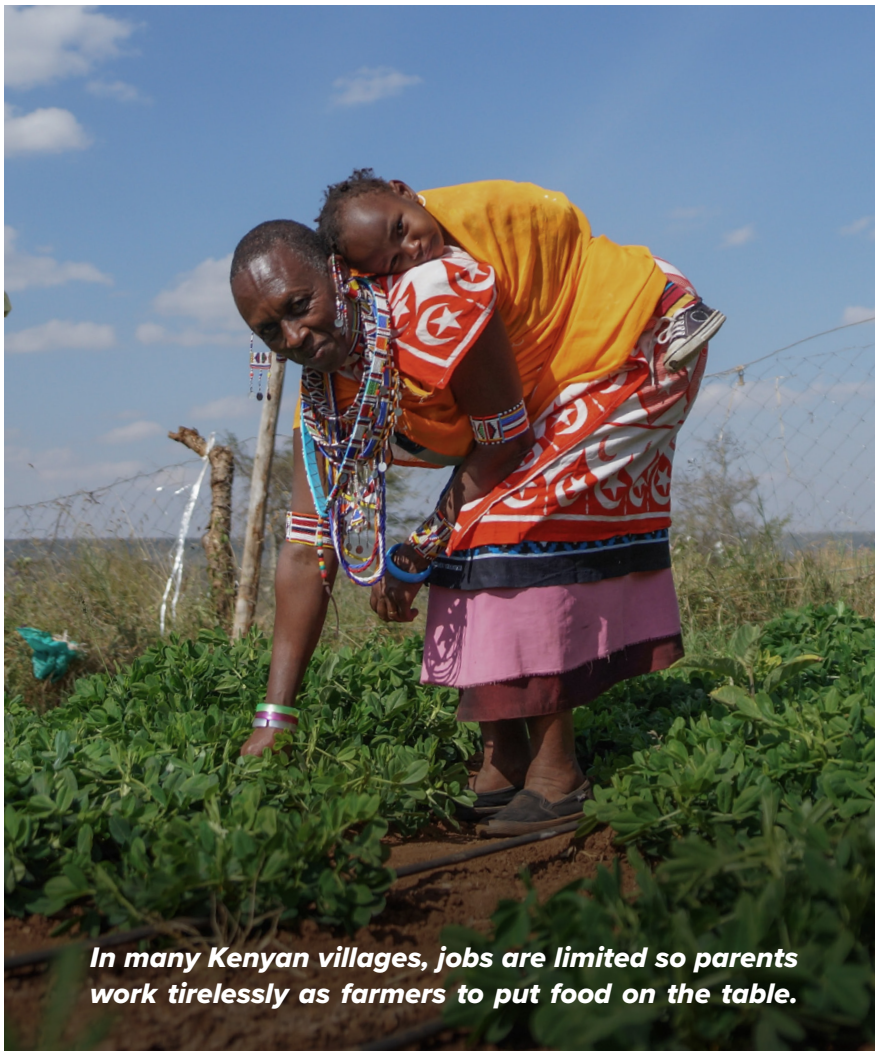
Mwandoro had been attending the Hossana Hope Center in Malindi, Kenya since he was 5 years old. Although Mwandoro received life-changing

care through OneChild's sponsorship program, Ndurya knew that this gift would help their entire family.

Child Champions at the center asked Ndurya and Mwandoro to come by the next day to settle on what they would like to purchase with the funds.

They decided to buy two chickens.

"I am grateful to the Child Champions who guided us and helped us choose a perfect gift that has transformed our lives," Ndurya says.



In many Kenyan villages, jobs are limited so parents work tirelessly as farmers to put food on the table.

At the time they received the gift, Ndurya was optimistic that the chickens would multiply and that his family would also have the luxury of eating eggs. He never thought beyond the increase in number but was determined to take care of the amazing blessing that his family had received.

Ndurya was a small-scale farmer and depended on rainfall to grow vegetables on his small piece of land. Malindi receives very little rainfall annually, which meant that Ndurya could only farm and harvest a few times a year. He would

sell as many vegetables as he could to people in his community and use the rest to supplement meals at home.

When he sold vegetables, he earned about \$2 a day. But the amount was never enough to cover school fees, clothes, and medical needs. And hunger always loomed.

This family living in poverty needed to find a way to earn more income — and the generous gift from Mwandoro's sponsors came at just the right time.

After receiving the chickens, Mwandoro and his siblings took turns caring for them. After a while, the number of chickens grew to 25.

“When the number increased, we would sell eggs and eat some,” Ndurya recalls. “We also sold chickens to pay school fees, and once in a while, we would treat ourselves to chicken.”

The family also bought two goats after receiving another gift from Mwandoro’s sponsors. “The goats sparked something in me,” Ndurya says. **“I had never had animals before because I could not afford to buy any, so when we received the gift, I thought that was a way of God opening my thinking.”**

As the family continued to take care of the goats and chickens, the goats multiplied, and they were able to sell chickens to buy more goats.

Eventually, the family traded the goats for a cow. The cow has given birth twice, so now, they own three cows. Ndurya sells the cows’ milk to cover the cost of food, water, and school fees.

Because of the critical drought conditions and skyrocketing inflation that is taking place in Kenya and across the globe right now, it’s more difficult than ever for families in poverty to survive. The extra income that Ndurya’s family receives makes an incredible difference.

“Thanks to my son’s sponsors, Richard and Lana, we’re able to meet most of our needs,” says Ndurya. “By supporting Mwandoro, my whole family has hope.”

Mwandoro, now 18, is in high school and dreams of becoming a police officer. And this courageous young man has witnessed that all things are possible with God. “I never have to worry about staying in school because the constant worry about paying school fees is a thing of the past,” he says. **“I am also happy that not only am I benefiting from the gift, but my family is also significantly benefiting. The family gift we received makes us hopeful for the future!”**
